Our group is led by women with disabilities. This means at least half of the group leaders must be women with disabilities. If you have a board, they must also be at least 50% women with disabilities.

We are open to sharing about our work with those impacted by it and being accountable to them fully.

We are willing to join in learning exchanges with ADD and other grantees.
